Admission

Kilohana Preschool is licensed to admit 68 pupils from two to five years of age, who are toilet trained, on a non-discriminatory basis without regard to race, color or religion.

Applications are available throughout the year for the following school year and admission is open on a continual basis, space permitting. A non-refundable registration fee is due with the application form. A tuition deposit is paid upon entrance and will be applied to the child's last month's tuition provided a two-week notice is given. All applications are processed in the order in which they are received.


In August, children are assigned to classrooms by the director with the twelve youngest in the first class. Class size ranges from 12 to 24 students. Staff to child ratios are usually 1:6 (2-3 year olds), 1:9 (3-4 year olds), 1:12 (4-5 year olds), with a teacher and an aide in each classroom.

Parent Participation

Parents are encouraged to assist in the classrooms (by prior arrangement with the teacher), to be a room parent, to share a talent or profession, to serve on the Kilohana Preschool Board, or to be a chaperone on an excursion.

Our goal is to help your child reach his or her potential physically, mentally, emotionally and socially in an atmosphere of love, security, acceptance and success.

Facility

We have four large, bright classrooms plus a napping room for our children. These classes are divided according to age, with the youngest children having the smallest class size.

Our beautiful playground is spacious, grassy and naturally shaded by large trees. It includes an ample sandbox, swings, an area for riding tricycles,



and a modern play structure designed specifically for preschool-age children. We also have a large, covered lanai for rainy day activities and special programs.

Faculty

The teaching staff and aides have been selected for their competence, experience and caring qualities. All of our teachers meet the State of Hawaii requirements for teaching in a preschool.
